CERTIFIED STATEMENT OF NEED FOR ADDITIONAL PUBLIC FUNDS (PARTICIPANTS ONLY)

In order to limit public funding in races where participants face minimal opposition, public funds payments are capped at 25% of the maximum. This cap does not apply if a participant is running in a primary or special election for an open seat (an office for which no incumbent is seeking reelection).

Except in open seat primaries or special elections as set forth above, participating candidates must demonstrate a need for additional public funds using this form once for every election in which they seek the maximum public funds. Only the candidate may sign and submit the Certified Statement of Need.

This form must be received by the CFB by July 29, 2013, to be considered for the first public funds payment of the 2013 primary election. For subsequent public funds payments, it must be received by the <u>filing deadline(s)</u> for the disclosure statement(s) preceding the scheduled payment date.

The CFB will verify the truthfulness of this statement and supporting documentation, which will be posted to the CFB's website.
