New York City will use Ranked Choice Voting in the June 22nd citywide Primary election.



You can now rank up to five candidates in order of preference, instead of choosing just one.

Step 1: Pick your 1st choice candidate and completely fill in the oval next to their name under the first column.

Step 2: If you have a 2nd choice candidate, fill in the oval next to their name under the second column.

Step 3: You can rank up to five candidates. You **can still vote for only one candidate** if you prefer. Ranking other candidates does not harm your 1st choice.
